Abstract:

The Colonel Ebenezer Francis Chapter of the D.A.R. Collection dates from 1923-1972. This particular D.A.R. chapter began organizing in 1923 and was officially founded on April 12, 1924. A large part of the collection is made up of membership applications, ranging from 1923 to 1955. Other organizational materials are also included in the collection. These include member lists and addresses, as well as biographical information and reports. There are numerous correspondences from the organization also seen in the collection. While this is the extent of the materials dealing specifically with the Ebenezer Francis Chapter, the collection also includes a number of materials relating to the National D.A.R. Included are documents from the D.A.R.'s continental congress meetings, newsletters and other materials distributed by the national organization. Also included are other materials, such as newspaper and magazine articles, discussing the D.A.R.

Provenance:

This collection was given to the Beverly Historical Society in 1962 by the Colonel Ebenezer Francis D.A.R. Chapter. Part of the collection was donated at a later date to be added to the original donation.

Related Materials:

A gavel included in the collection is housed separately due to the nature of the material.

Processor's Note:

The materials were originally in folders and boxes. The membership applications were organized alphabetically by folder within a box, but many of the applications within the folders were not completely organized. The processor organized these documents alphabetically so that there would be consistency throughout the series. The rest of the materials in the collection were not organized. The remainder of the documents were organized into different series based on their content. The materials that are dated are organized chronologically within the series.

Historical Note:

The Colonel Ebenezer Francis D.A.R. Chapter was founded in Beverly, MA on April 12, 1924. Its first regent was Mrs. Ralph Stanley, who played a major role in forming and expanding the organization. The chapter was named after Ebenezer Francis, a soldier from Beverly who fought in the American Revolution and died in battle. The chapter formed with eight founding members, expanding to 35 in 1925. The chapter began holding functions, most notably in Independence Park, to celebrate the area's history and involvement in the American Revolution. Members also later became involved in national D.A.R. functions, and their time at the annual D.A.R. Continental Congress meetings are well documented in this collection. Over the years, women living in the area who qualified continued to join the organization, helping it grow. This is reflected in the numerous membership applications in the collection that cover the chapter's first 22 years.

The National D.A.R. was formed in 1890 and includes over 300,000 chapters. The national organization holds yearly meetings in Washington D.C. in which the Colonel Ebenezer Francis Chapter often took part.

Scope and Content Note:

A large portion of the collection consists of membership applications. These applications were submitted by those seeking to enter the Ebenezer Francis D.A.R. chapter. They begin in 1923, during the forming of the chapter and are collected through 1955. Some applications are seemingly absent, as there are missing alphabetical sections. The applications provide important genealogical information for families who can trace their ancestry to the American Revolution in Beverly. They provide a complete familial lineage for members who were approved. Many of the applications also give detailed information about the member's ancestor and how they participated in the Revolution.

Included in the collection are various other materials related to the D.A.R. There are numerous materials that document the founding, expansion and activities of the Ebenezer Francis Chapter. This includes lists and information of the chapter's members. Also included in the collection are correspondences between the Ebenezer Francis Chapter and other organizations. These documents display different activities and functions of the organization.

Another part of this collection include other materials relating to the National D.A.R. There are a number of different types of materials seen that deal more with the national organization. The Continental Congress materials detail the annual meetings that the National D.A.R. held, in which members from the Ebenezer Francis chapter attended. Other materials from the national organization include newsletters and pamphlets. The collection also contains other materials, such as newspaper and journal articles, that discuss the D.A.R.
